

## PERSONAL APPEARANCE AND DRESS CODE

Wayland Academy asks students to dress in a manner that demonstrates respect and consideration for oneself and others. Hallmarks of the dress code include being neat, clean, and well-groomed. Wayland Academy reserves the right to determine whether clothing follows the dress code.

### Personal Appearance

Boys must be clean-shaven (no mustaches, stubble, or sideburns below the ears) during the academic day and formal events, except seniors. Beards are not allowed without a special exemption from the Dean of Students.

### Academic Day School Dress

The following dress code applies to the academic day and at times when students are asked to be in “school dress.”

### The Four Required Daily Components of School Dress:

- Dress pants (patterns are allowed; cargo style pants/shorts or those with torn hems are not)
- Belt—All students
- Button-down collared dress shirts or polo-style shirts (long enough to stay securely tucked in)
- Any closed-toe and closed-heel shoes

### Other school dress policies:

- Clothing worn for school dress are to be free of words or pictures (e.g., a large picture of a kitten or the name of a college across the front).
- Ties are optional for all students.
- Capri pants and Bermuda shorts (hemmed within three [3] inches of the knee) are allowed as determined by the DOS.
- All pants, capris, and shorts must be worn above the hips.
- A turtleneck shirt may be worn, but only with a blazer, sweater, or cardigan.
- Leggings, yoga pants, jeans, lycra material bottoms, other casual pants, and skirts are not allowed.
- Sleeveless, sheer, semi-sheer, and cropped shirts, or shirts with holes are not allowed.
- Sandals of any kind are not allowed.

- Hats and outerwear (coats, jackets, sweatshirts, crew necks, hoodies, etc.) must be removed when indoors.
- Underwear may not be visible at any time.

### Formal Dress

On certain formal occasions, students have a very specific dress code. All students are required to wear these items for **formal dress**:

- Navy blue blazer
- Tan or gray solid-color dress slacks worn with a belt (shorts are not permitted for formal wear)
- Solid-white dress shirt, always tucked in
- Closed-toed dress shoes or dress boots

### Jeans Days

When Jeans Days are offered, attire for participants will be hemmed jeans, without holes or tears above the knee on the front or back. Tops can include Wayland apparel or academic day dress (button-down collared dress shirts or polo-style shirts that are long enough to stay securely tucked in).

### Senior Dress Privileges

Commencing Monday, April 21, seniors not on the Guided Study Hall (GSH) list and who maintain good social standing will be allowed a relaxed senior dress code during the academic day, with the following allowances:

- Wayland apparel tops
- College or university apparel
- Pants, Bermuda-length shorts, or capris with patch pockets (no jeans)
- Modest blouses (not low-cut, cropped, sheer, or revealing)
- Dresses or skirts hemmed within three (3) inches of the knee or longer
- Spaghetti straps or strapless dresses are not allowed (**straps must be at least 3" wide**)
- Crocs and sandals are not allowed in science labs, but sneakers are fine

### Dress Code Violations

The Dean of Students will be informed of students who do not adhere to the dress code. Students will be held accountable for their choice; additional violations will lead to additional consequences set by the Dean of Students. Regular violations of the dress code will reduce a student's privileges.

### Attendance

Students are expected to meet all of their commitments at the Academy. This includes attending weekly Chapel, Assembly and Mentor Lunch, along with athletics and all other cordial events (the term "cordial" at Wayland Academy means mandatory)..

Absences are reported to the Academic Office on a daily basis. Attendance in classes is of the utmost importance. Failure to attend a class can put the student at a disadvantage in the course. Students are responsible for any and all classwork, assessments, homework, or lessons missed as a result of any absence—excused or unexcused.

**Parents of day students** must contact the Academic Office by email at [attendance@wayland.org](mailto:attendance@wayland.org), or by phone (920-356-2120, ext. 248) by 8 AM if a student won't be attending class due to illness or bad weather. If a student misses class due to a medical appointment, a doctor's note should be brought to the Academic Office immediately upon arriving at school. If a student is absent due to a scheduled appointment, it is expected that the parent contacts the Academic Office in advance and that the student gets homework assignments from the teacher(s) prior to the appointment. **Be sure that your attendance email includes:** name of the student, date(s) of the absence, times in and out, and, if taking a partial day, the reason.

All assessments missed as a result of an unexcused absence may receive a penalty and can only be made up at the discretion of the teacher and Director of Curriculum, Instruction, and Innovation. Final determination of excused and unexcused absences rests with the Director of Curriculum, Instruction, and Innovation.

Students arriving late to campus or leaving early for scheduled breaks must have advance permission from the Director of Curriculum, Instruction, and Innovation or Head of School.

### Unexcused Absences

Students missing two or more classes during the academic day due to illness may not participate in athletics, fine arts, study groups, or any other activities that evening.


